 - Report what cards were sent and any deceased members at your Auxiliary meeting. (This may be done by the Veterans & Family Support Chairman.)
 - Prepare for the Memorial Service, if the Auxiliary is to have one. (A list of deceased members may be obtained by the Auxiliary Treasurer in MALTA.)
 - Prepare and make contact with the Auxiliary members if a Memorial Service is to be performed at a funeral home or given location.
 - Be prepared at all times with the items needed to perform the Memorial Service for deceased Auxiliary members.
- And a District Chaplain
 - Perform the opening and closing prayer at all meetings and events.
 - Present the names of those who are ill, deceased, etc., at your meetings.
 - May send thinking of you, sympathy and get-well cards in accordance with the District's policy.
 - Prepare for the Memorial Service, if the District is to have one. (A list of deceased members may be obtained by the District Treasurer in MALTA.)
 - Educate the Auxiliaries on the duties of the Chaplain.

Welcome to our NM Department Auxiliary Legislative Program for the 2022-2023 Year. I am excited and honored to have been chosen as your Department Chairman for this important program. This month I will share information about the program's goals and purposes, and each month I will endeavor to find and share lots of ways we can stay informed and involved in the



legislative process that has helped our service members and their families obtain the help and benefits they deserve.

Following is a section of the draft written by our National Ambassador Bobbie Goldman, to be included in this year's National Program Book, which describes the goals and purposes of the Legislative Program:

Be An Advocate • Be Informed • Be Engaged

The main objectives of the Legislative Program is to improve the lives of our veterans, service members and their families through advocacy. Your efforts, combined with nearly 1.5 million other VFW and Auxiliary members, can influence lawmakers whose decisions

affect veterans and their families every day. Join the chorus of voices that will ring out in legislators' offices this year.

Study the issues laid out clearly in the VFW Priority Goals. A copy can be found on the National website at vfwauxiliary.org by selecting "What We Do" then clicking on "Legislative."

The Priority Goals reflect the resolutions passed by the VFW to strengthen and ensure an adequate VA system for millions of current and future veterans.

They call for much-needed attention to crises such as veteran homelessness and suicide. They request fully funding research on traumatic brain injuries, reducing the claims backlog, fighting veteran unemployment and improving timely transition assistance for veterans after leaving military service. The goals are grouped under six areas of concern:

- Budget
- Health Care

- Disability Assistance and Memorial Affairs
- Education, Employment and Transition Assistance
- Military Quality of Life
- National Security, Foreign Affairs and POW/MIA

One of the most crucial responsibilities of the VFW Washington, D.C. office is to actively lobby Congress and the administration on behalf of veterans. The office monitors all legislation affecting veterans and alerts VFW and Auxiliary members about key legislation under consideration.

By testifying at committee hearings and interacting with congressional members, the VFW played an instrumental role in nearly every piece of veterans' legislation passed in the 20th Century, as well as bills developed in the 21st Century.

- 3. Hands that serve, Hearts that Care Award to one VFW Auxiliary member in the nation who recruits the most new members from July 1, 2022 through May 31, 2023. The award will feature the member's name on it alongside the name of an honored veteran. Department Treasurer and VFW members are not eligible.

My Husband and I will go into greater detail regarding scholarships at the July training. I hope that there is good attendance, as there will be a wealth of information regarding all programs.

In the meantime, reach out to local summer youth programs, and ask if you can schedule a day to speak with the students about our scholarships. The following are just a few ideas:

- ROTC programs usually work through the summer. Reach out to the commander to set up a time to visit their school or for them to come to your post.
- Visit local boys' and girls' clubs.
- Visit summer sport teams.
- Do a google search for summer youth art classes in your area.
- Contact any teachers that are members at your post or auxiliary.
- If they were not seniors, contact your applicants from last year to reapply.
- Host a youth arts and crafts day at your post.
- Advertise on radio, Facebook, and at public events in your community.
- Make an information board summarizing scholarship information if you are advertising at a public event.
- Follow up frequently with teachers and students to make sure they do not have any questions, and to remind them of upcoming deadlines.

It's always a good idea to have copies of scholarship applications on-hand. Pass a few out to each member at your next meeting. Many of us have a relative who is eligible to apply for one of these scholarships.

Lastly, it's not too early to start fundraising. Monetary awards Are appreciated and a great way to show our communities that we support local youth. It is also a great motivator to apply for our scholarships.

It is now almost time to do your year end June 30th Audits, invite both 21-22 and 22-23 Trustees to the Audit.

Now back to the grave beautification project – National would like the auxiliaries to work with youth not only to put flags on the graves sites during special days like Memorial Day but to teach and remember why these soldiers have these special headstone. Why we have the freedom and rights that we continue to enjoy. Most cemeteries have a care taker in general who does the general maintenance, but often they do not clean around the grave sites or the headstone of the veterans. This is left up to the families of the veterans if they have any.

For this project to work need A) some kind of permission from the cemetery owners usually the church council. B) Refer to Youtube for videos demonstrating how to clean headstones and what to clean them with so that you don't damage the stone (kids are great for this part). C) before and after pictures. D) Keep a log of gravesites beautified (record name of veteran, site number, which cemetery, and town). Remember to leave them a flag.
