News from National

Form 990-N filers will use a new sign-in process beginning this summer Beginning August 2022, smaller charities that are eligible and choose to file Form 990-N, Electronic Notice for Tax-Exempt Organizations (e-Postcard), must sign into the IRS modernized authentication platform using either their active IRS username or create an account with ID.me, the current IRS credential service provider.

When accessing the [Form 990-N submission page](#), Form 990-N filers have three options:

1. Sign in with their active IRS username: Users with an active IRS username have the option to access the Form 990-N submission page using their existing IRS credentials or they can choose to create a new account with ID.me.
2. Sign in with their existing [ID.me](#) account: Users that have an ID.me account to access other IRS online services or from a state or federal agency can sign in using their existing ID.me account.
3. Create a new [ID.me](#) account: Users that don't have an active IRS username credential must register and sign in with ID.me.

ID.me account creation requires an email address and multifactor authentication. Form 990-N filers who have an existing IRS username and register for an ID.me account must use the same email address.

We are happy to report that the first phase of moving the resources from our website to behind MALTA has been completed!!!

Here's how you now access "Items behind Login":

First, you must have a MALTA account or create one by following the directions.

Next, log in to MALTA.

On the blue bar, you will now see two added features, Cancer Grants and Member Resources. All members will be able to click on Cancer Grants to see and print the form to request a cancer grant. This form must have the original signatures of both the doctor and the member (or a copy of death notice if deceased). Therefore, this is not a fillable form.

All members can also click on Member Resources where they will see the Program Book, Family Freedom Festival and Building on the Auxiliary Foundation. To the left is the list of all the programs and miscellaneous resources.

If you click on a file with a link, it will take you to that link. If you click on a file with a document, the document will appear at the bottom of your screen, click on the box to open.

Phase Two will be moving the Treasurer Resources to behind MALTA.

We hope you all like this new way to view and access our resources!

Congratulations and many thanks to all of you who took the time to respond to the Action Alerts and contact your Congressional Senators and Representatives: WE DID IT! THE PACT ACT was passed!!

Here is a portion of the announcement published on www.vfw.org the day this historic act was signed into law:



August 10, 2022

WASHINGTON — After years of persistent advocacy, National Commander of the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Tim Borland, families of loved ones affected by toxic exposures and other veteran service organizations, stood together behind President Joseph Biden at the White House as the SFC Heath Robinson Honoring Our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics Act of 2022, the landmark bill focused on assisting toxic-exposed veterans, was signed into law Wednesday morning.

“What an honorable moment in history for veterans!” exclaimed Borland after the event. “The PACT Act becoming law is the largest expansion of veteran benefits since the creation of the VA. My sincerest thanks to the members of Congress, I am so proud of all the hard work VFW staff, our Action Corps and VFW members everywhere did to push Congress to pass this bill and was honored to represent our organization at the White House on this historic day.”

I am so excited and proud that our Auxiliary members were able to be a part of this event by joining together with our Post and members throughout the country and making our voices heard through ACTION CORPS WEEKLY. It is such a powerful resource that opens the door to this type of victory for our veterans and their families. Keep encouraging your members to subscribe, so they can be sent those ACTION ALERTS to stay informed of bills and take action when their support is needed!

In the words of Bobbie J. Goldman, our Auxiliary National Legislative Ambassador:

“36 Senators changed their vote from no to yes, and the bill didn’t change. The only explanation is that so many people like us were pressuring them, that they had no choice.”

It works! Together we can make a difference!

Finally, we have also been reminded that it is important to know that the VFW does NOT endorse all bills that may have “veterans” in the description. Go to <https://votervoice.net/VFW/bills> to see a list of what bills the VFW supports. I thought it was interesting to see what has been accomplished with the help of our VFW and what is currently being supported by our organization. We should

be very proud. Thanks again, and don't forget to REPORT your efforts each month!!!

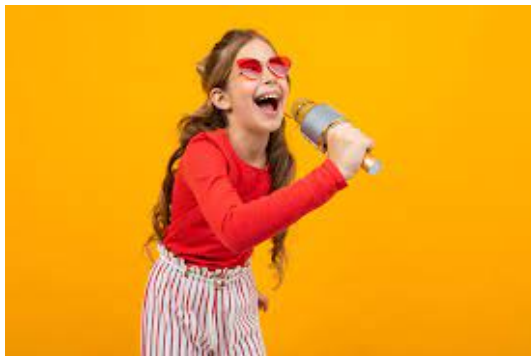

Francis Scott Key wrote this song in 1814. One Hundred years before the Auxiliary became established. Contest is open to all youth k-12. Must be a US citizen or US national. Contest will be judged on vocal ability, mastery of lyrics, originality or interpretation and entertainment value. Contest consists of two divisions k-8 and 9-12.

Now here comes the RULES: need a video of contestant's solo vocal performance of the SONG and must be recorded between July 1, 2022 and

March 3, 2023. Video performance must be saved as a YouTube video. Please do not ask me how to do this.... I don't know ask a kid. Contestant may sing the SONG a cappella, or with background track or instruments. Two more rules contestant may sing in the arrangement and genre of their choice and last DO NOT change the words. If the SONG lasted this long with the original words from Francis Scott Key, don't mess with it.

First place winner from this State will be sent to National headquarters. There will be a first, second, and third place winners in each division.

Entry form are at vfwauxiliary.org website and the vfwauxnm.org website too. Entry form must be received by the local auxiliary by March 31, 2023. Auxiliary need to get this information to band teachers, 4H groups, church choirs, FFA, and music stores.

Looking for clues and help with VFW Auxiliary Outreach? Read on for a few to get started.

IMPORTANT: Do not confuse Auxiliary Outreach with VFW Community Service. Auxiliary Outreach is one of our 12 National Programs.

Guess what? Community Service is not one of them.

You may have heard the term CSR. This is the acronym's definition: CSR = Community Service Report

VFW Community Service

Please continue to help your VFW Post by completing a VFW Community Activities Report. Coming soon on the VFW Auxiliary website will be an Auxiliary-tailored Community Service Report Form. See what it looks like below. Until that time, please borrow a form from your Post to use.

Think of the VFW Community Service Report as a HUGE umbrella. This umbrella protects and covers our heads to keep our non-profit status safe.

Does your Auxiliary already have a VFW Community Service Report form they give to their Post on a regular basis? GREAT... Make sure you modify it to include or update the name to Auxiliary Outreach and stress that NO money is spent on any of your Outreach Programs.

Money you donate to other organizations and spend on other activities that do not qualify for Auxiliary Outreach can be listed on that CSR form.

Always reach out to your Department Auxiliary Chairmen for up-to-date information. If you have not checked out the Auxiliary Outreach Awards see the [2022-2023 National Program Book](https://vfwauxiliary.org/what-we-do) at vfwauxiliary.org/what-we-do.
