AUGUST FEATURE: THE FOUR PILLARS OF THE VFW NATIONAL HOME

The VFW National Home provides families with much more than a house.

Its programs, resources, staff, volunteers, and supporters work together to help families create stability, strengthen relationships, overcome challenges, and prepare for independent futures.

This month, we are highlighting four important areas that demonstrate how the National Home supports the **whole family**.

PILLAR ONE — COMMUNITY

At the VFW National Home, families become part of something larger than themselves—a caring and supportive community.

The beautiful campus near Eaton Rapids, Michigan, includes **43 single-family homes**, recreational facilities, playgrounds, walking and hiking trails, a gymnasium, library, educational resources, and community gathering spaces.

But community is about much more than buildings.

It means:

- Neighbors supporting neighbors
- Children developing friendships
- Families participating in activities together
- Veterans connecting with others who understand military life
- Families knowing they do not have to face difficult times alone

For families experiencing uncertainty or transition, that sense of belonging can be an important part of rebuilding their lives.

Community reminds every family: You are not alone.

PILLAR TWO — WELLNESS

Strong families need opportunities to heal, grow, reconnect, and develop healthy routines.

Wellness at the National Home focuses on supporting the whole person and the whole family.

Recreation, outdoor activities, family experiences, supportive services, and therapeutic opportunities help create an environment where families can move forward.

Programs such as:

-  **Heroes to Hives**
-  **Guitars for Vets**
-  **RAVE — Regenerative Agriculture for Veterans**

provide veterans with opportunities to discover new interests, develop skills, build confidence, and connect with others.

Wellness also means creating positive experiences for families and children so they can make new memories together.

Wellness helps families replace uncertainty with hope.

PILLAR THREE — EDUCATION

Education creates opportunity.

The National Home provides resources for both children and adults to learn, develop new skills, and prepare for their futures.

Campus educational resources include the:

-  **Child Development Center**
-  **Library**
-  **Computer and Science Labs**

Children also have opportunities to participate in programs such as **4-H**, where they learn responsibility, leadership, teamwork, and agricultural skills.

For adults, educational and employment assistance can help veterans and family members pursue new careers, improve employment readiness, and work toward greater financial independence.

Every class completed, new skill learned, résumé prepared, or career goal achieved can become another step toward a family's successful future.

Education gives families the tools to build tomorrow.

PILLAR FOUR — ADVOCACY

Sometimes the most important support is simply having someone who knows where to turn.

Veterans and military families may qualify for benefits, services, educational opportunities, employment assistance, or community resources they do not know are available.

Through advocacy and resource assistance, the National Home helps families navigate those systems.

Support can include:

- Veteran Service Officer assistance
- Veteran Navigator assistance
- VA benefits guidance
- Employment services
- Educational support
- Referrals to community resources
- Assistance identifying additional programs and services

Advocacy means helping families understand their options and giving them guidance as they determine their next steps.

Advocacy helps ensure our veterans and military families have a voice and a path forward.

FOUR PILLARS — ONE MISSION

COMMUNITY gives families a place to belong.

WELLNESS helps families heal and grow.

EDUCATION creates opportunities for the future.

ADVOCACY connects families with the resources and support they need.

Together, these four pillars help create a strong foundation upon which veterans and military families can rebuild their lives.

JULY NATIONAL HOME UPDATE

Families, Programs & Progress

July was another busy and productive month at the VFW National Home.

HOUSING & FAMILIES

The National Home maintained 39 occupied homes out of 43, while four recently vacated homes were being prepared for incoming families.

Two new families were welcomed to the National Home community during July, moving into the New York 2 and Colorado homes.

In addition, six families were moving through the assessment process.

These numbers demonstrate that the need for the National Home's services and opportunities continues.

4-H & THE EATON COUNTY FAIR

National Home youth proudly participated in the Eaton County Fair, showing hogs and rabbits they had raised through their 4-H experiences.

One young participant earned FIRST PLACE for his rabbit!

The program provides another example of how hands-on activities can build skills, purpose, confidence, and community.
